



Chiropractic Makes the World a Better Place

Four-hundred and fifty-four jobs were compared based on their sense of job meaning, salary, job stress and job satisfaction. Chiropractic resulted as number seven of the top ten paying jobs for “people who want to make the world a better place.”

Doctors of chiropractic (DCs) – who receive a minimum of seven years of higher level education – are able to provide patients with relief from back ache, neck pain, and so much more. Helping people achieve that feeling provides meaningful work to most DCs. As a result, 92 percent of chiropractors feel that their jobs make the world a better place.

The United States currently has over 70,000 practicing chiropractors, and 18 accredited chiropractic colleges with 10,000+ students. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reports chiropractic has one of the lowest unemployment rates of all occupations, and the profession is expected to grow 17 percent from 2014 to 2024, much faster than the average of other occupations.
